Atlantis Marine World (AMW) will host its very first Shark Dive wedding on Wednesday, November 22 at 6:30pm.

Kew Gardens, New York residents Michele Nelson and Joseph Fulton will take wedding day jitters to a new level as they enter AMW's 120,000-gallon Lost City of Atlantis Shark Exhibit along with their Reverend, Joseph DeVincenzo, and encounter more than 10 sharks and an array of fish during their once-in-a-lifetime wedding ceremony.

"We love the ocean...we love the water...and yes, the idea of a Shark Dive wedding is unique and different but that's also who we are," gushes bride, Michele Nelson. "We are really, really excited!"

New in June 2006, AMW's Shark Dive is one of the few programs in the world where adventurers can enter the ocean's top predators' environment wearing an all-new underwater helmet which allows normal breathing and communication underwater.
